What is a Safeguarding Partner?

The government announced plans to replace all Local Safeguarding Children Boards (LSCBs) with 3 Safeguarding Partners by September 2019. Under this new plan, each locality will have access to its own dedicated team of Safeguarding Partners who will work collaboratively to strengthen the child protection and safeguarding system in your local area. The Safeguarding Partners will be a team of key professionals from three sectors: the local authority; the clinical commissioning group for any area that falls under the local authority; and the chief officer of police for any area that falls under the local authority.
