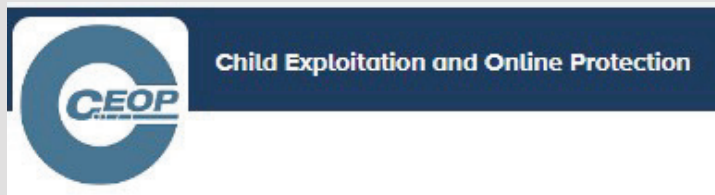

## Non-Consensual Nude Image Sharing

Non-consensual nude image sharing is when nudes are shared without the consent (permission) of the person in the image. Sometimes nudes get shared around in group chats. Or even more widely than that - on social media or public websites.

### What to do if someone else's nude is being shared around

- Get help. Even if the image is not of you, you can go to adults and support services to help that person.
- Don't judge the person in the image. It is likely they didn't expect anyone else to see the image. It is also not fair to make jokes or unkind comments about them. They probably didn't intend to harm or upset anyone by taking or sending it.
- Never show the nude to anyone else. Even if you're thinking about sending it on because it's shocking, don't. Every time a nude is shared, it causes more harm to the person in the image.
- Offer emotional support to the person in the image. Support from friends will be crucial in helping them get through a really difficult time.

## Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE) and Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE)



Both CCE and CSE are forms of abuse that occur where an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance in power to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child into taking part in criminal or sexual activity. It may involve an exchange for something the victim needs or wants, and/or for the financial advantage or increased status of the perpetrator or facilitator and/or through violence or the threat of violence. KCSIE, DFE (2024)

Some specific forms of CCE can include children being forced or manipulated into transporting drugs or money through county lines, working in cannabis factories, shoplifting or pickpocketing. They can also be forced or manipulated into committing vehicle crime or threatening/committing serious violence to others. Children can become trapped by this type of exploitation, as perpetrators can threaten victims (and their families) with violence or entrap and coerce them into debt.

## Safeguarding in FE (Sept 2024)



Keeping children safe in education is statutory guidance that schools and colleges in England must have regard to when carrying out their duties to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. It is essential that everybody working in a school or college understands their safeguarding responsibilities.
